We will be assisted by Maroochydore and Coolum Police, Twin Waters Residents' Association and Maroochy North Shore Lions, and would love some more volunteers so contact the Residents' Association, phone 5448 9414, if you would like to help.

These one-way screws help prevent and reduce number plate theft occurrences. The theft of number plates often leads to further property crime related offences, such as fuel drive-offs, break and enters and traffic offences.
