COMMUNITY SAFETY BULLETIN by Tony Mortley,

Twin Waters NHW Area Co-ordinator— LPG (PROPANE BBQ CYLINDER STORAGE

Over recent months there have been a number of vehicle and residential fires started by vapours leaking from LPG Gas Cylinders stored in confined spaces.

The Australian Standards regulations relating to the storage of cylinders strongly advises that they should be stored in well ventilated areas to allow the escape of vapours if the seal malfunctions within the valve.

A minimum amount (e.g. 50 ml) of liquid LPG remaining in a used cylinder will expand 270 times to a vapour that if coming in contact with an ignition source will ignite and create a catastrophic event.

Neighbourhood Watch strongly recommends that all cylinders should be stored outside in a safe area, out of the sun and away

from child access.

Sharing Our Pathways



Please show courtesy towards others and be

aware that our footpaths are shared areas. Many riders do not feel confident on our busy roads or narrow streets such as in Twin Waters, and riders are allowed to ride on footpaths, even if there is a bicycle lane on the road.

Bikeriders/Skateboarders:

- Keep left and give way to pedestrians at all times.
- Warn when approaching. Cyclists must use a bell, skateboarders call out. (Be aware that some pedestrians are hearing impaired and some are unable to move quickly.)
- Don't obstruct the path.
- Always ride to the left of bicycle riders/ skateboarders coming towards you.
- Do not ride with your dog, either on a lead or running along beside you.

Pedestrians:

- Please be aware that cyclists could be approaching from behind so listen out. If you are hearing impaired, or wearing headphones, be extra vigilant.
- Keep to the left.
- Keep your dog on a lead and close by your side.
- Don't obstruct the path. If you are walking with others and space is limited, show courtesy by moving over while being passed by a bike rider/skateboarder. If you stop to have a chat, move off the pathway.

Target harden your home—

After recent break-ins in Twin Waters, Coolum Police are reminding residents to "target harden" their homes.

Officer in Charge of Coolum Police, Senior Sergeant Hardy Wirth said some premises were left unlocked, giving thieves easy access to enter.

"By 'target hardening' we mean installing good quality locks to doors and windows, installing security grills, alarm systems and CCTV cameras where possible," Senior Sergeant Wirth said. "It also extends to security lighting and trimming trees and branches to appropriate heights."

"These types of measures make it more difficult for opportunistic thieves."

Remember to:

- Lock your doors and secure windows when leaving
- Lock your car and the garage when out or at night
- Lock away items of value, including pushbikes, power tools, etc
