## COMMUNITYPULLS TOGETHER FOR TURNING THE SCREWS'—



On 22nd April Twin Waters Neighbourhood Watch joined local police, police volunteers, Maroochy North Shore Lions and TWRA for a very successful 'Turning the Screws' event, when one-way screws were fitted to vehicle number plates. Each year hundreds of number plates are stolen across Queensland and these screws, which can only be removed at a police station, help prevent would-be thieves from removing number plates and using them to commit crimes. Number plates were secured to 77 vehicles.

## VEHICLE SECURITY—



The police are concerned that the incidence of thefts from motor vehicles seems to be increasing. Cars are broken into on both drive-ways and roadsides, as well as at service stations.

We would like to remind everyone to ensure that

their vehicles are left secured at all times and that you remove valuables — including items such as handbags, wallets, laptops, mobile phones, keys, tools, garage door remotes, and mail — or at least put them out of sight. Lock your vehicle as soon as you get out to fill up with fuel and even when it's in your garage.

These simple precautions will reduce the likelihood of your vehicle or possessions being stolen.

A number of vehicles on the current stolen list have been stolen as a result of a 'sneak break' — offenders have entered homes through unlocked doors and stolen quick and accessible items such as car keys and wallets. *Remember that home security is important as well!!*

## BEWARE OF myGOV SMS AND EMAIL SCAMS—



**Scammers are targeting people with messages claiming to be from myGov.**

The security of your personal details is important to myGov. And your details are very secure.

myGov will never SMS or email you asking for identity or financial details, or send you live web links

**If you get, or someone you know gets an SMS or email from a sender identifying as myGov, you should not supply your identity or financial details.**

It's important to remain alert to possible scams. You can contact myGov straight away if you are concerned about the security of your personal details.
