Our annual meeting is coming up!

It's that time of the year to again turn towards our Annual General Meeting and the election of Office Bearers and members of the Management Committee. Our AGM will be held as part of our general meeting on Monday 13 August 2018. Nominations for the positions of President, Secretary and Treasurer, plus the other Management Committee positions, close on Wednesday 11 July 2018, as required in the Constitution. Nominations must be in writing – a standard form will be available from our website at www.twra.net. Nominations are required to be signed by a proposer and seconder, plus the nominee, all of whom must be current financial members of the TWRA.

The role of the President is to lead the Association: to chair all general and

management committee meetings, and be an ex-officio member of any sub-committee. The Treasurer receives and banks all income, pays the approved invoices and expenses, provides financial reports as required and deals with the appointed Auditor/s for the Association. The Secretary receives and distributes all correspondence, takes minutes of all general and management committee meetings, distributes the minutes and provides the approved minutes of the AGM and general meetings for inclusion on the website, and maintains the required paperwork for the Association. The Secretary is also the appointed "Public" Officer" for dealings with various Government Departments. The Secretary also advises members of meetings, and arranges the bookings for regular meetings of the Association. The other members of the Management Committee are appointed to lead or work on sub-committees that may be of special interest to the Association and its members. These include the Newsletter, the Website. Facebook, Birthday in the Park, Christmas Carols & Fireworks, other member activities such as sporting events, dine-outs. Christmas in July etc., the Airport Forums and dealings with Council on Maintenance Issues and other special projects and areas of interests as required. We look forward to seeing Twin Waters residents at the AGM in August.



Start reducing plastic

Living right next to the ocean, it's extremely important we don't litter, and refrain from wasting plastic.

Queensland will be implementing a plastic bag ban from July 1st, so here's a few ways to get ready.

- 1. Reusable bags: to avoid having to pay for a bag at the counter, keep a few reusable carry bags in your car. Of course, this will soon be our only option, so why not start now?
- 2. Quit bin liners: although it may seem like

more work, you can simply tip your indoor bins right into your council bin. Separate your food scraps to be composted (to avoid mess), and, of course, put your recyclables in the yellow bin.

- 3. Avoid plastic packaging: fruit and vegetables should never need to be packaged! If they are, don't buy them. For any other products, try to find ones with paper packaging rather than plastic. Even at the deli counter, you can bring your own reusable containers for foods like cheese and meat.
- 4. Buy a reusable coffee cup and metal straw: many cafés will give you a discount for bringing your own travel mug, so there's no need to be wasteful.

Also, many Sunshine Coast restaurants are banning straws, so having your own will always be helpful.

5. Never buy bottled water: just one plastic bottle can take thousands of years to break down. Buy a stainless-steel water bottle and simply refill it.

If you absolutely must buy a drink, try to find one that's packaged in glass, or at the very least recycled plastic.

Airport Update

Progress on the Sunshine Coast Airport Expansion is underway, with visible activity beginning. If you travel along David Low Way, past the airport, you'll see the clearing of sand dunes in preparation for the sand pumping pipeline installation.

In the dune area near the Northern end of the airport, the pipeline will be assembled, which will be connected to a dredge buov approximately 750 metres off the beach. The complete pipe will also be positioned under the David Low Way in such a way to minimise any traffic issues.

The pipeline should become visible in the near future as all sand pumping work must be completed prior to the start of turtle breeding season.

Project Director Ross Ullman told a recent Community update, "As soon as the dredging has been completed, the pipeline will be removed from the seabed, beach and dune area so that dune restoration work can be completed."

In preparation for the sand to be pumped into position, visible earthworks have also commenced in the Western end of the airport land, which can be seen when driving along the Sunshine Motorway.

It's taken a while!

The recent ground-breaking ceremony to mark the start of construction at the airport has prompted us to dig into the TWRA's archives. On 30 July 2006, the TWRA made a substantial submission in response to a Draft Master Plan for the airport, that had been put out for public discussion a few months earlier. The TWRA submission called for two very significant changes to the draft plan.

First, there should be an immediate priority on the planning and development of the East/West runway.

Second, the proposal for an extension to the existing North/South runway, by 200 metres to the North, should be abandoned. The draft plan was subsequently withdrawn, and a new Master Plan was prepared during 2007 that adopted our recommendations. The TWRA has had significant influence in shaping the direction of what has happened at the airport. These changes will bring enormous benefits to the Coast and to our community.

Old woman island is the perfect day trip

Living right next to the Pacific Ocean has its benefits. As Sunshine Coast locals, we spend our weekends swimming and sunbathing at beaches, and enjoying the relaxing atmosphere of our region. Living in Twin Waters, we are blessed with easy access to Old Woman Island, an uninhabited rock sitting in close proximity to the coastline.

You've probably seen the iconic island from many of our other beaches, or even the summit of Mount Coolum, but have you ever visited it?

Old Woman Island is located approximately 1.2km from the shore of Mudjimba Beach, so it's easy to paddle to.

It's extremely popular with surfers, fishers and scuba divers, because there is fantastic surf and plenty of sea life.

The island can be accessed by anyone, but for those without much experience, it may be difficult. It's a good idea to have a more experienced person show you around before attempting the trip alone.

Mudjimba SLSC treasurer Narelle Robertson calls the island a playground. "If it's a really flat morning, you'll find there will be a big group of people that will congregate and paddle over together," she says. "There is what we call the 'Keyhole', where you can paddle right in, and depending on the waves, land quite safely on the island."

So, grab your shoes and sunscreen. No matter how you choose to get there, Old Woman Island is here for you to explore.
