### **Mystery at Twin Waters**

On Friday, 18 August 1995 Tabbatha Rachelle Hodge aged 21, had been organising her own birthday party which she was looking forward to celebrating with her family and friends. Unfortunately, the Hodge family became embroiled in one of the Sunshine Coast's biggest investigations.

The image of the young, blonde girl and the story of how she simply disappeared quickly became known throughout Australian households.

On Saturday, 19 August 1995 Tabbatha was listed as a missing person.

Missing person posters adorned the roadsides, newspapers (including the Sunshine Coast Daily) kept the public informed and a \$50,000 reward was offered. Tracing her footsteps, the police discovered that Tabbatha was last seen at 11.10 pm on 18 August.

She had gone to Noosa with a few girlfriends. She came back and picked up her car from a girlfriend's house in Pacific Paradise and drove off, and that was the last anybody saw of her.

Despite thousands of leads and hours of searching, Tabbatha Hodge was not found until 26 March 1998. Her Laser Sports car was located in a canal at Twin Waters and a coroner's inquest found it was simply a tragic accident.

It was less than a kilometre from her friend's house to where they found her.

A dredge was dredging out the canals as

routine work. Nobody really knew what happened.

For the two and a half years it took police to find Tabbatha, interest in the case never wavered.

### **Ten Years Ago**

Back in November 2009, the State government was advocating that a desalination plant be built on State-owned land at Marcoola, adjacent to the Sunshine Coast Airport.

At the time, the Premier Anna Bligh, said the plant at Marcoola would be operational by 2017. This was strongly opposed by the local community which, apart from concerns about the economics, also opposed the construction of such a "blight on the landscape" immediately adjacent to the Airport which was viewed as a tourism gateway to the Sunshine Coast.

A public meeting on Monday, 16 November 2009 at Marcoola Surf Club was well attended by locals and strong messages

of opposition were sent by State and

local representatives.

The idea appeared to emerge from the then recent defeat of the proposed Traveston Crossing Dam on the Mary River which was to supply much-needed additional water capacity for SEQ.

Of course, the desal plant was not built and the relevant State-owned land at the airport was subsequently transferred to the Council as part of the arrangements for the building of the new East-West runway.

Another by-product of that desal proposal was that Energex, in anticipation of the extra energy requirements for it, built the large sub-station adjacent to the Motorway.

A lot of money was spent on filling and raising the site, installing lines and most, but not all, of the equipment. The substation has still not been completed and commissioned after many years.
