# **Airport Community Forum**

This year will be a very big year for Sunshine Coast Airport, with the new runway being completed. TWRA is a participant in the Airport Community Forum and their meeting on 4th December was provided with an update on the development. Most importantly, Council has announced that the first flights are scheduled to land on the new runway on 22 May next and use of the existing North-South runway will cease from that time to enable completion of the eastern end of the runway and associated taxiways. Formal completion and commissioning is still on schedule for December 2020. This is a huge milestone and one the TWRA has been following for many years — we made our first submission for the East-West runway back in 2006!

The new runway surface is well under way, with more than 400,000 tonnes of fine crushed rock (almost eight times the weight of the Sydney Harbour bridge) and 64,000 tonnes of asphalt being placed on top of the compacted sand embankment. Another good news item is that Council will no longer be releasing the ponded water accumulated on the site to the ocean. The drier conditions and re-use on site has resolved the potential issue.

A new management team is now in place at the airport. The new GM, Andrew Brodie, spent 9 years at Brisbane airport overseeing the construction of the second runway. He has a new team of experienced GMs and the whole team is well placed to position SCA for the future and capitalising on the opportunities from the new runway here.

### **Clean Up Twin Waters**

The annual Clean-up Twin Waters event will be held on Sunday, 1st March, from 8.00 am to 10.00 am. As usual, it will commence with a BBQ breakfast at Baywater Park at 8.00 am. Please bring your hat and sunscreen. TWRA will provide bags and gloves for the event. Paddlers to clean the waterways are also most welcome.

It is a fun community event as well as an opportunity to meet other residents. Please make a diary note now. Many hands make light work! We will be finished by 10.00 am at the latest.

# **Council Elections - Candidates Forum**

As foreshadowed in December, the TWRA is arranging a Candidates Forum for the forthcoming Council elections on 28th March. It will be held at 6.00 pm on Friday 20th March at North Shore Community Centre. The whole purpose will be to provide an opportunity for candidates to each make a statement about their policies and for a Q and A session where attendees will be able to ask each candidate questions about what they will stand for if they are elected on 28th March. # Ocean Drive & Nojoor Rd Intersection Upgrade

As we know, the Ocean Drive & Nojoor Road intersection has been a concern for a long time, with too many collisions, near misses and issues around visibility when turning there. Last year, we managed to secure some interim upgrades to signage and line markings and, importantly, thanks to Council representations on our behalf, access to some federal Black Spot funding, with the help of Ted O'Brien's office.

Further upgrades under this Black Spot program are about to commence including concrete traffic islands, improved lighting, paint marking and cycle paths.

Thanks to TWRA Committee member, Dave Dunwoody, who has been championing for these important safety upgrades to occur.

# Twin Waters Rainfall Stats for 2019

The total rainfall for Twin Waters (TW) in 2019 was 1249mm. Compared to 2018, TW saw a drop (pun intended) in the annual rainfall of over 490mm and a 249mm drop against the Bureau of Meteorology's (BOM) 25-year average of 1498mm (recorded at the

Sunshine Coast Airport).

Overall, the highest rainfall in TW fell in March (260mm), April (252mm) and October (226mm). The driest months were January (uncharacteristically 7mm), August (10mm) and September (7mm). It is noteworthy that in each of these three months TW experienced no rain at all for almost 21 consecutive days! Given that the rainfall recorded at TW varied significantly – both in volume and timing – from BOM's published averages, it is reasonable to ask what the rainfall forecast is for 2020? An extensive internet search revealed that BOM seems to be willing to only put its name to a 3 month forecast and even then it is pretty much a 'two bob each way' effort: 'The rainfall outlook for January to March 2020 indicates most of the country will have roughly equal chances of a wetter or drier than average three months.'

On the other-hand according to Farmonline and Elders; 'The current outlook now favours a clearer below average rainfall signal for the eastern states. This however, excludes any extreme weather events such as East Coast Lows or tropical cyclones in Queensland.' Keep up the rain dance..........



# **Twin Waters Emergency Planning**

The horrific summer of bushfire catastrophes across Australia has prompted many people to ask about Emergency Planning for Twin Waters. In the past, TWRA has asked this question of authorities and we have been reassured that we are not in a "high risk" category zone. Regardless, over the last three months, we have been again pressing for more complete answers and assurance from Council. Council has agreed to work with TWRA to develop an Evacuation Plan, including such details as emergency meeting points, evacuation pathways and other necessary details. The Council's Co-ordinator Disaster Management, Cathy Buck, will be the guest speaker at the April General Meeting on 20th April.

In the meantime, we will continue to work on this and keep the community advised.

We are truly blessed to have so many wonderful native animals in this area of the Sunshine Coast. When walking around the water ways each morning, there are so many different birds, water dragons, fish and stingrays enjoying Twin Waters.

Driving up the road a couple of weeks ago, out the corner of my eye appeared a "black thing" flapping about. Coming back a few hours later to investigate, the black thing was in fact a crow that was tangled up in fishing line. Unfortunately Wilvos (they assist with rescuing Wildlife) were unable to come and untangle the crow. So a couple of Twin Water residents assisted with capturing this quy. Lloyd and another gentleman went home collected a towel, a box and some secateurs to help cut the crow away from the small shrub. As a team we launched into action and caught Clyde (apply named as he and his partner Bonny, the two outlaws, harass possums in their neck of the woods), one threw the towel, one cut him away from the shrub and Clyde then headed off to the Emergency Vet at Tanawha to have the fishing line removed. Lucky for Clyde, he only lost a toe, had he been left much longer, he would have lost his entire foot as the fishing line was cutting deep into his foot.
