# WIN WATERS RESIDENTS'ASSOCIATION

#### Twin Waters Residents Association "What It Does"

The TWRA is, and has been, central to making this community one of the best places to live on the Sunshine Coast. Next year, it will be 25 years since a very small group of new residents met in a garage in Twin Waters Drive and resolved to establish a residents' association. Now the TWRA has more than 500 families as financial members. Those of us who have been involved over the years with the TWRA, always as volunteers, can be very proud of what has been achieved by and through the TWRA. As we approach our 25th year, it is worth reflecting on the contributions of the TWRA.

There have been some very big issues where community input, via the TWRA, has been decisive in the shaping of our community today. There are two standout issues - the development and implementation of our unique landscape maintenance arrangements and the determination of the future of the land to the west of us, which was known as the Canelands, now Twin Waters West.

Our landscape maintenance arrangements were developed between 2001 and 2005 to establish the principles for the higher standards of public landscape infrastructure maintenance existing today. Back then, there were no precedents and the TWRA engaged with Council to develop a model that has since been used as a blueprint for other master-planned communities across the Sunshine Coast.

The second issue was the future of the Canelands. Lend Lease initially declared their intention to replicate the Twin Waters development on that site but later sold their interests to Stockland. In 2008, Stockland proposed a "first home buyer" style development that was the antithesis of Twin Waters and would have been detrimental to the character and amenity of our community, let alone our property values. The TWRA was instrumental in opposing the development and, ultimately, was successful in 2013. Since then, Stockland has engaged and the current proposal is closer to a standard, which would be "equal to or better than the existing Twin Waters". That story is still unfolding. The TWRA's communications platform is another of our central contributions. This Newsletter, which has evolved over the years from a single A4 page, is produced monthly and is delivered to every residence in Twin Waters. There is our web site, www.twra.net, where you can find historical and current information about our community and we have a FaceBook and Instagram presence as well. Regular TWRA Emails to members communicate important information and we receive feedback and comments via info@twra.net.

Then there are the social and sporting activities. The annual TWRA Christmas Carols & Fireworks event at the Novotel is a community highlight in December, in October there is the Birthday Party in the Park, we have Christmas in July as well as other social events such as the TWRA Cocktail Party last month (which sold out within days). Sporting events arranged by the TWRA include the annual Golf Day at Twin Waters Golf Club plus occasional bowls events. We also sponsor the Clean-up Twin Waters event in March. Of course, we also have our bi-monthly General Meetings where members and residents are encouraged to attend and express their views or listen to guest speakers.

Our elected State and Local Government representatives are strong supporters of TWRA and regularly attend our General Meetings and events.

It is significant that everything done by the TWRA is undertaken by volunteers who are committed to making our community a great one. We have generous support from local businesses and the Council and we are always grateful for this support. There are always opportunities for members to contribute by filling roles on the Management Committee or on the various sub-committees and teams that manage or organise our activities. Importantly, as we approach our AGM in August, we encourage members, especially newcomers, who have an interest in contributing to the community to step forward and volunteer to help us. It's a great way to meet locals, feel connected to your community and make a difference. We are all presently enjoying the benefits the TWRA has brought to Twin Waters so join us to ensure the future of our fabulous community!





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#### **Twin Waters Real Estate is Strong!**

It's the current BBQ stopper conversation - the subject du jour! What's happening in our Twin Waters real estate market? Everyone knows someone who has sold recently "for a good price"! If you look at sites like realestate.com, houses for sale in Twin Waters are not being shown with list prices but with terms such as "make an offer" or "expressions of interest invited". Open houses are well attended and there are often sales made within days. These are all signs of a strong market. While we might think that the new runway at SCA has helped us, the truth more likely lies in wider economic factors - the post-COVID strong economy and population shifts from the big cities to regional locations, especially from Sydney and Melbourne to Queensland. The wise and lucky ones have chosen the Sunshine Coast and Twin Waters in particular. Welcome to all our newcomers!

Recently, My Weekly Preview published a supplement containing real estate data for the Coast, including Twin Waters. The data, collected and published by CoreLogic, showed that at the end of 2020, the median price of homes sold in Twin Waters reached \$938,200 - an increase of 18% over the comparable figure for the previous year. For apartments in Twin Waters, the median price was \$689,800, a 9% increase for the year. The latest data, published in The Courier Mail on 8th May, showed that the median price for houses in Twin Waters as of March 2021 has now topped \$1m. There are only a handful of suburbs in Queensland with median prices above \$1 million (actual figure for TW was \$1,007,607) so this is a milestone for us. The median price for apartments was \$721,460. If you would like to discuss your situation in more detail, there are several real estate agents active in our area, including the six leading agents who advertise in our Newsletter. We are confident any or all of them would be happy to talk to you!

### **Sunshine Coast Mass Transit Project**

The Sunshine Coast Council is planning for the future by considering proposals to improve public transport.

The public consultation period has already commenced for the Sunshine Coast's Mass Transit project. Consultation is open until 22 June 2021.
