Lions Provide Defibrillator for Twin Waters

Heart Foundation figures show that CHD claims more lives than any other disease, responsible for more than one in ten of all deaths. This equates to CHD killing one person every half hour, or on average 50 people every day. Saint John's Ambulance research shows that the probability of survival increases dramatically when CPR is performed and when an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) is applied before an ambulance arrives. The challenge is having a Defibrillator close by that is readily accessible.

Maroochy North Shore Lions have taken a step toward helping locals access this life saving device.

Looking for ways to use a donation from TWRA locally, Lions decided on two options. One was extra playground equipment at Warwick Daniels Lakeside Park and the other to provide a Defibrillator at the Twin Waters Village. Lions called Jason O'Pray about putting equipment into the park however Council have plans for a major upgrade in 2022 so that option wasn't possible. Jason encouraged Lions to apply for a grant to obtain the defibrillator. They did and he approved it.

Lions President Tricia Parkinson spoke with business owners from Twin Waters Village who were pleased to locate the equipment there. It is in a highly visible and accessible spot on the wall adjacent to the Pharmacy. The defibrillator is a fully automatic unit that guides a user through some simple steps to apply. Grant Ormrod, Chairman of the Twin Waters Village Body Corporate, said "We are so appreciative of this generous gesture and believe it is a valuable asset to our Twin Waters community."

We all hope it will never have to be used. Please remember it is there if an emergency arises at any hour of day or night. Most importantly, if you have any signs of a heart attack call 000 for an Ambulance.

Bull Sharks in Our Waterways

At the GM on 14th June, Dr Johan Gustafson (Griffith Uni) and Raeleen Draper (SCC) presented a fascinating overview of the studies of bull sharks in our waterways across the Sunshine Coast and greater Queensland. Bull sharks are part of our natural environment and we need to expect that they will be around, including in the Twin Waters lakes and waterways. The shark pups are born in fresh water zones and, as they grow, they move towards more saline environments and ultimately to the oceans. They can live for up to around 40 years. The bull sharks in our area are likely to be juvenile sharks up to around 1.6 metres. The Griffith Uni studies aim to tag and monitor the sharks. When they were here, they only managed to tag one shark, so the data from here is very sparse. More research is needed. However, Johan and Raeleen both commented on the favourable marine environment here and the variety of fish species that can be found in our lake. But always keep an eye out for the bull sharks!

TW Landscape Maintenance Update

Work has commenced to refurbish the roundabout at the intersection of Ocean Drive and Baywater Drive. This will include improvements to visibility at that intersection.

Seasonal mulching in our parks will take place in coming weeks. This year, the mulching will be on a needs basis - only those areas where mulch has reduced will have their mulch renewed. The state of the walking path along Ocean Drive adjacent to the golf course continues to be "under negotiation". The existing path encroaches on golf course land and needs to be realigned, or a sliver of land purchased from the golf course. This is in Council's hands, but is being closely monitored by the TWRA to get an early result!

We have a 14-year-old boy who has Type 2 diabetes and is hooked to a permanent machine limiting his ability to do things other boys his age do. He generally finds fitting in at school pretty tough. With us, he is totally free to be himself. The horses don't pass any judgement on him. Then there's the young man who rides with us every week. When he first started coming he was totally non-verbal. He had never said mum or dad. Imagine the joy of everyone when he uttered his first word - Lou - the name of the horse he rides! There are so many stories just like these. So like me, if you want to brighten someone's day, put a smile on someone's face and really make a difference, you can become a volunteer or make a donation to this special place where Riding Develops Abilities. "

Sunshine Coast Riding for the Disabled (SCRA) is always looking for new volunteers to join their team. No experience of horse handling or experience with disabilities is required. All new volunteers are trained and mentored. The first Wednesday of each month is set aside for New Volunteer Orientation and Induction. No need to book, just come along at 1 pm for a couple of hours with closed footwear and a big smile! Not confident with horses? There are a myriad of jobs at the Centre: administration, grounds and equipment maintenance are some examples where a regular and responsible volunteer would be appreciated.
