
#### TWRA AGM

# **Twin Waters History ~ Lendlease**

Twin Waters was developed by Lendlease Corporation. Most will agree that they did an excellent job, especially when Twin Waters is compared with almost all other contemporary residential developments on the Sunshine Coast.



During their development period, from 1996 to 2005, their onsite development managers were generally very engaged and committed to a great community outcome. In the early years, a land buyer would be invited to a "get to know you" event that they held about every three months so that new buyers could meet other new buyers. Lendlease supported the TWRA via sponsorship of events like the Carols but we did have some "run-ins" with them! They were still developers, after all!

An accumulation of grievances over the plans for development of the area on the other side of the Tamarind and Blue Water Court waterways in 2002, led to the famous "Bulldozer Bob" incident, when a Blue Water Court resident chained himself to a bulldozer and called Channel 7!

The upshot was a negotiation to resolve several grievances that actually took place down at North Lakes with a party representing residents and Lendlease executives from Brisbane. Perhaps the most significant part of the negotiated "settlement" was that Lendlease agreed to revise plans for the Viewpoint site from six level apartments (similar to Magnolia Lane) to a mix of two and three storey apartments and town houses and the whole development on that site was also moved a minimum of 30 metres further away from the waterway. One other aspect worth commenting on was their focus on making sure that the landscaping looked at its best for the weekend sales push. The roundabouts along Ocean Drive were planted with golden privet hedges that look amazing but were quite high maintenance. The parklands, e.g. along Twin Waters Drive, were irrigated to make sure they were always green and kept freshly mown.

Lendlease's attention to the public landscaping is one of our unique features and how this has been maintained is another story from our history, but for another day!

#### Infrastructure Update

The upgrade to the roundabout at Ocean Drive and Baywater Drive has been completed. The refurbishment of the pathway along Ocean Drive alongside the golf course is still a "work-in-progress" but recent communications with Council indicate that some action should commence soon. Council is now planning a realignment of the footpath and is aiming to have a contractor commence the work in mid-late August. Some land is still required to be purchased from the Golf Club but these arrangements can be finalised concurrently. We will keep you posted.

#### **Census is Coming!**

Census night is on Tuesday 10th August 2021. Australia conducts a Census every five years. Participation is compulsory for everyone and it covers every person who is in your home on Census night. In early August, the government will send you instructions on how to take part. This year you can complete your Census as soon as you receive your instructions, if you know who will be home on Census night. This is different to past years when you had to fill in your form on Census night.



The latest SCA Community Airport Forum meeting was held on 8th July via a virtual format.

The airport is concentrating on achieving more domestic services at more convenient times to current destinations. The recent announcement from Virgin that they will be doubling the number of services to the Sunshine Coast is an example of this.

Air New Zealand is planning to offer year-round services to the Sunshine Coast. The twice-weekly service will add an additional 14,000 seats per year and deliver an \$8m boost to the region. Two additional temporary structures will be built at the airport to provide extra space for health screening and police checks. The SCA will also embark on a 24-36 month terminal upgrade project. Improvements will include passenger-screening facilities, baggage claim upgrade and extensive landscaping.

#### **Turkey Deterrent?**

Here in Queensland many of us can relate to the problem of brush turkeys digging up garden beds.

A few years ago this newsletter ran an article from our local WILVOS giving us suggestions as to how we can learn to live with these native species.

But a new great solution may be at hand! By planting Mother of Herbs (Plectranthus amboinicus) throughout her garden beds, an ABC Gardening Australia viewer finds that the turkeys leave her garden alone and it seems to be because they don't like the scent. Mother of Herbs is also known as Four Seasons Herbs or Cuban Oregano or Five Spice. In fact it has about 19 different common names!

Residents at Magnolia Lane Apartments are at present trialling this natural deterrent so we might all study the evidence once the data is in! If you are interested, check your local nursery for availability of this plant.

#### **Bike Safety**

It is pleasing to see many residents taking the opportunity to use our paths and roads to enjoy some exercise on bikes and safety is a paramount issue for everyone.

Twin Waters resident, Ross, thoughtfully sent through useful reminders for us all. Thank you, Ross!

• Always wear an Australian Standard approved helmet.

• Your bike must have at least one working brake and a warning device such as a bell.

- Only ride on paths where a sign permits bicycle riders.
- Always ride on the left and give way to all pedestrians.
- Use a hand signal by extending your right arm out when turning right.
- All road rules apply including the use of mobile phones.

Other riding tips include:

• Ride slowly past pedestrians. Ring your bell but be aware that they may not hear you if listening to a device.

• Beware of an opening door from parked vehicles.

• Keep to the left hand side of the road at all times and do not cut corners. Vehicles and other riders may come from behind you.

• Improve your visibility to others - have a front white light and rear red light. Information source: Qld Government Bicycle Road Rules and Safety
