### New Kayak / Canoe Launching Access

## Ocean Drive Path along Golf Course

Council has drawn up plans and intends to purchase some land from the golf course to rebuild the footpath along Ocean Drive between Tralee Place and Lytham Court. When surveyors began to identify the actual area of the pathway they discovered some alignment issues. Because of safety issues for pedestrians, Council is negotiating with the Golf Course owners to purchase a strip of land before they can start the rebuilding of the path project. The works will also ensure proper drainage near Tralee Place. This work is scheduled for completion during the current financial year.

Twin Waters buries past and present

Twin Waters' residents eelebrated the 13th anniversary of their community and Queensland's 150th birthday on Sunday by burying a time capsule at Lake View Drive Park

The Twin Waters Residents Association coordinated the collection of more than 30 items for residents to discover in 25 years. Contents of the time capsule included the latest Living in Twin Waters

Living in Twin Waters brochure, a letter from the TWRA president, current editions of local newspapers, local shop and housing price lists, the development history and pictures of the area.

Also included was Twin Waters Prayer, written by 10-year-old Twin Waters' resident Chiara, who won a competition held in conjunction with the celebrations.

TWRA president Geoff Billard said it was important for the Twin Waters' community to acknowledge the significance of Queensland's history.

"Being one of the youngest communities on the Sunshine Coast, we felt compelled to commence Q150 with a significant and memorable activity to mark this point in time for Twin Waters," Mr Billard said.

"The TWRA canvassed content ideas from the residents, coordinated the burial site with council and arranged the collection and preservation of more than 30 Rems for the future residents to unearth in 2034.

This month, 12 years ago, when Queensland celebrated its 150th anniversary back in 2009, a Time Capsule was buried in Warwick Daniels Lake View Park, to be recovered in 25 years - that's 2034! The site is now covered by a large rock with a brass plaque recording the burial of



the capsule and the proposed recovery date. Community ideas for what should be in the capsule were sought and more than 30 items were placed in the capsule for residents in 2034 to discover. It would be a spoiler to name them all now, but there are items that record the then current grocery and house prices, the history and development of Twin Waters, as well as some then everyday items that have already been superseded by technological development. # North Shore Community Centre Celebrates 10 years!

As our local community centre is about to celebrate 10 years, it is appropriate to reflect on some of the background behind the NSCC logo. The logo was created and designed by active local artist Jodi Myuna of Pacific Paradise. Jodi's drawing was chosen because of the thought and meaning that was attached to it. The Pandanus tree is familiar and known to all as a favourite beach-side tree of the North Shore area. The three branches of the tree represent the landmarks surrounding the North Shore area, the river, the ocean and the mountain. The colourful hands represent the many colourful people that make up our community, from our children through to our elders. The stylised circular roots typify the ongoing community involvement of the North Shore Community Centre. The small rocks encircling the logo represent the Aboriginal Bora Ring left by the Undumbi people and found in the North Shore in the 1800's.

Born in Dandenong, Victoria, Jodi Myuna, did most of her schooling on the Sunshine

Coast, where she graduated high school at Caloundra in 1984. She then went on to study a Bachelor of Fine Arts at JCVU before moving to London. She expanded her horizons there working in the Art Department at Pinewood Film Studios on a number of commercial and music film clips including U2 and Kylie Minogue! Upon returning to Australia, Jodi added another string to her bow eschewing a career in Stage Management. ## **Shorebirds of the Sunshine Coast**

Council's Shorebird Conservation Action Plan aims to raise awareness of shorebirds on the Sunshine Coast, with a particular focus on the lower Maroochy River and Pumicestone Passage.

As part of this plan, they commissioned local artist David Houghton to create a shorebird mural on the public amenities block at North Shore. The mural painting was to have been started on the 13th of September with works to be completed within two weeks.

If you are fascinated by the wonderful birdlife seen everywhere here on the coast, accessible on YouTube since 20 Dec 2020, SUNSHINE COAST SHOREBIRDS is a new series that explores the life of shorebirds from the Pumicestone Passage to the Maroochy River. These birds travel 384,400

kilometres throughout their life during migration. These incredible creatures fly half-way across the world – and we are lucky enough to have them settle here on the Sunshine Coast.

# Twin Waters Life Saving Club

The warmer weather is approaching fast and we will see a lot more people on our beaches as summer approaches. Surf Life Saving Queensland (SLSQ) was formally established in 1930 although the first official rescue took place on a Queensland beach in 1909! Since then, SLSQ has 57 surf lifesaving clubs with members patrolling 8,000 kilometres of the Queensland coastline from Port Douglas to Rainbow Bay. Did you know there is a difference between a lifesaver and a lifeguard? Lifesavers are people who volunteer their time on weekends during the summer season and they work together with a local lifesaving club. A lifeguard is a professional who patrols the beaches all year round. While the name on their uniforms may differ, their aim is the same: zero preventable deaths in Queensland waters. The SLSQ is a not-for-profit organisation and their work is vital to keeping all people safe on our beautiful beaches. Let's try to make their job easier by remembering to always swim between the flags! Heartfelt thanks to our lifeguards and lifesavers!!

Discover the difference that improved filtration will have on your swimming experience As the water flows through the equipment, the coarse sand filters the dirt particles from your pool to ensure your water is healthy. Over time this sand becomes smooth, which means your equipment must run more frequently to accomplish the same task. This inefficiency in turn increases the amount of sanitiser used and raises your chemical and power costs. And after five years, even backwashing your equipment does not clean it completely due to the sand being worn.

Complete Your Sand Change before Summer is here!

Option 1: Sand Change

If your filter is in good condition, you can have the sand inside removed and replaced with new sand.

Option 2: Change the Filter and Sand

If your filter is leaking or at risk of breaking the laterals, change the filter and the sand together
