# **President's Report**

The recent warm weather in spring has seen the gardens and native trees come to life with new growth and an abundance of flowers. The flowering native bushes like the grevillea and callistemon (bottle brush) have been lush with flowers and attracting the many native birds.

During the spring Maintenance Review meeting with Council there was discussion about some garden and public space areas that needed further attention and quite a detailed list generated. I am pleased to say that the contractors (The Maintenance Company) are working through the list with some very visible improvements which has included some additional mulch where needed and some new plantings.

Hopefully the work they have done will not be damaged by the activity of some scrub turkevs!

One of the areas of concern raised by Contractors was the dumping of garden waste into park and open space areas from some residential properties. These include grass clippings, tree prunings and palm fronds. As part of the public space audit reports Council will provide detail of on-going areas of concern. The only palm trees planted as part of the original development are in the roundabouts and also the Lake View Drive area from the old sales office to what were the display homes. Council tell us that other palms planted in the streetscape have been done by residents.

We can all work together to make sure we maintain the standards.

After a somewhat troubled year we are finally approaching Christmas and a big "Thank You" to Margaret and the team organising the Christmas Carols. On behalf of the TWRA Management Committee we wish all Twin Waters residents a wonderful Christmas. Festive and holiday season and a happy and prosperous New Year.

# History of the Nativity scene at the Twin Waters Carols

Six years ago, the Carols Committee decided to feature a Nativity Scene as part of the Community Carols and Fireworks Event. Warwick and Betty Daniels were the co-ordinators at the time. The idea came from the Baptist Church Maroochydore display each Christmas. After getting the committee to attempt some drawings, it was clear that a professional was needed. The artist, Clive Holden and his wife, were given some idea of the required look and placement of Bethlehem on a backdrop. This allowed for figures, etc. to be placed in front with the scene still clear in view. There was a slight issue of what Bethlehem would've looked like then - the first drawing had high rise buildings in it - not guite right for biblical days! The backdrop is about 5 metres wide and storage became an issue.

Val and Con Guard organised a pole around which it could be rolled and stored and Val even made a fabric bag long enough to protect it.

The idea of the figures came from residents in Watergum Place. They had large figures on display in their front yard as a local nativity scene. When asked, they gladly loaned them for the Carols history of community behind it. Just another example of how past provided they were picked up and replaced afterwards. However a problem arose a few years later when the house was sold and the family took the figures with them. The figures had been made in memory of a son who had passed away. SO... the Committee decided to create their own figures. Pat Hamilton did

The TWRA asked Living Choice if the residents could help in producing the nativity figures. Current committee member David Hughes was convenor of the committee that oversaw the Wood Workshop activities. David also discussed the project with the Village Ladies Painting Group, of which his wife Bunty was a member, and they also became involved in the project. The figures were traced onto plywood and with the help of another member of the Committee, John Bishop, all the figures were fabricated. There had been big hopes for a couple of camels to be included but storage would've been a problem! This was eventually solved by the generosity of the APEX facility on Nojoor Road. The ladies painting group painted all the figures and Tony Brown from Maroochy North Shore Realty agreed to pay for the cost of the materials as part of his sponsorship.

The figures are a constant attraction for children you love to view it. To keep both scene and children safe, Bob Gavin constructed the low fence around it that is clipped together every year. So, as you can see, our Twin Waters Nativity Scene has a rich and current residents have left and continue to leave a legacy for the future in our wonderful Twin Waters Community!

#### **Local Flora Christmas Bells**

Christmas Bells (Blandfordia grandiflora) are aptly named because they come to our attention when flowering starts in late Spring and Early Summer and so we are coming into or it is the Festive Season. They grow in

coastal or near-coastal grassland areas where we flock to in and around Christmas. This exceptionally pretty plant likes waterlogged areas and grows in clusters mostly near the beach, but some populations grow on tablelands.

Grandiflora, is one of four species of Blandfordia and occurs in Queensland down to around the Hawkesbury River in NSW. The flowers are bright red with yellow tips or they
