Site Visit to Twin Waters West as Appeal Case Begins



On Tuesday, 19 July, the appeal case over the proposed Twin Waters West housing development 'came to town', to see the proposed site for themselves. The pic above shows the small party at Settlers Park on the edge of the affected area. The case officially began the day before in the Planning and Environment Court with opening statements from developer, Stockland and Sunshine Coast Council. Hearings are expected to last 4 weeks. The fence that isn't there

This is the Absolute Last Word on the Ocean Drive footpath beside the Twin Waters Golf club. SOLE NOMINATION FOR PRESIDENT - SOPHIE LEVER

Sophie has lived on the Sunshine Coast since 1994 and been the Secretary of the TWRA for the past 14 years. A longstanding businesswoman, her substantial solicitor practice is located in Twin Waters. Sophie also holds a Surf Life Saving Bronze Medallion and has been awarded a Commendation for Brave Conduct by the Australian Government.
