Maintenance continued from Page 1

Baywater Drive (picture on the left) is another priority for the Maintenance Committee in its discussions with Council. Seen as an 'entrance statement' for a significant part of Twin Waters, residents have complained that many of the trees and palms are fading and should be replaced. As part of the recent discussions conducted during the inspections with the TWRA, Council suggested installing flowering native trees that would provide a more attractive look. Trees suggested include, Ivory Curls, Lemon Myrtle, flowering eucalypts and native frangipani. Work would be done in the new financial year. Discussions continue. More details next month.

In the meantime, following the recent inspection walkaround with the Council about general maintenance, where notes and photos were taken, the Council had a follow-up inspection with the new contractors, The Plant Management Company. Issues covered included, self-seeded weeds, defined garden edges, palm fronds not being removed in time, mowing frequencies and spraying of weeds. The Maintenance Review Committee and Council will meet again in early February and review progress and performance. We will report back in the next newsletter, or before with community emails to TWRA members.

SPEEDING ON THE LAKE- STILL A PROBLEM

The holiday season has seen a noticeable jump in complaints to TWRA about boats exceeding the 6-knots (11 kilometres per hour) speed limit on Twin Waters lake. Apart from safety issues, excessive bow wash from speeding boats increases wear and tear on revetment walls. Sunshine Coast Council advise residents can report offenders to Marine Safety Queensland (07) 5585 1810 or A/H (07) 3305 1700.

Hefty fines are possible under the legislation. But residents should have details to hand of the craft, time and location – and photos if possible.
