At Our June Meeting:

You Can Bank on It

Judy Blackall, the Manager of Marcoola Community Bank (a division of Bendigo Bank) gave an interesting talk on how the bank operates in our area. She outlined a program of the bank's whereby they give away 50% of their profit each year. They certainly are very different from the Big Four.

When the Bendigo Bank started in 1990 it had 5 branches. They now have 583. Their customers own them. Not the other way around. This year they will give away \$1 million on the Sunshine Coast and local projects are ear-tagged as places of interest: two in Twin Waters/Pacific Paradise, one in Marcoola, one in Coolum and one in Peregian.

A survey has been conducted on how that money should be spent in the future and it seems the idea of an indoor velodrome - a multi sports complex at the end of David Low Way just before the airport got a serious look in. Local, State and Federal Governments are being consulted now. Also the Marcoola branch will continue to support our annual fireworks.

New Councillor Visits

Ouncillor Jason O'Pray, our newly elected Sunshine Coast Regional Council representative for Division 8, was welcomed and congratulated on his election win.

Despite only being in the job a few weeks, he briefly outlined some of the plans for our area. He also commented on the Council's commitment to their budget of \$638 million and their desire to reduce costs for ratepayers. One project that was of interest was the desire to develop an area at the end of Nojoor Road and construct a boat ramp and car park along with the necessary amenities.

Power to Lake View Park

We have been advised by the time you have received this newsletter Council will have completed the laying of electrical cabling to the park and will be waiting on Energex to make the necessary power connection. The park was protected from damage by

WATERWATCH Maroochy Waterwatch Inc. is a not-for-profit community organization, based

Nambour, acting to protect and enhance the Maroochy River catchment and region. The office has few paid workers, operating with a large volunteer component of local people who actively promote improving the health of the Maroochy River. River Patrol has about 30 volunteers go out on the river weekly to collect rubbish. About 60 volunteers are involved in scientific testing for river water quality.

MWW Inc also operates two commercial entities; Maroochy Catchment Services and the Coolum Community Native Nursery, as well as hosting the Sunshine Coast Earth Smart Schools Initiative.

The Catchment Services offer vegetation works, fauna surveys, and water testing. The Nursery, based on a Lend Lease developed site at the Palmer Coolum Resort, operates under a partnership between MWW Inc and Coolum District Coast Care Inc. It is focused on propagating and promoting local sun-hardened coastal plant species for the maintenance of functional bio diverse ecosystems in the Coolum area. Seed collection and propagating at the nursery is assisted by many volunteers.

The Schools Initiative, funded by State Government, is a science program for primary state schools encouraging whole-ofschool approach to wisely managing school resources, focusing on reducing waste, conserving water, being energy efficient

and teaching biodiversity and sustainability values to children.

Real Estate Insight

rant Ormond, Senior Sales Executive for LJ Hooker at Twin Waters, gave us an insight into the current real estate situ in our suburb acknowledging that the downturn in sales/purchases for the Sunshine Coast as a whole has reduced by 20% in the last two years but is only 15% for Twin Waters.

In the last 12 months 105 homes have sold in Twin Waters by LJ Hooker averaging at \$615,000.

he Council have advised us that the raising of the low section of the wall at View Point will be carried out as a matter of priority in the next budget.

Community Vegetable Garden

↑ /e have had discussions with Council regarding suitable land for our scheme. The most suitable land which we think would be big enough is currently owned by Stockland.

The Council have indicated that if we wanted to use this land we would have to enter into negotiations to lease the land. Because of our position in opposing Stockland in their appeal process on the redevelopment of the cane lands we would find negotiations with them inappropriate at this time. Even if we did secure some land there are other hurdles to jump. We have been told that in order to get the scheme up and running we have to provide insurance, toilet facilities and a first aid station.

Due to the difficulties and the costs involved it would not seem to be a proposition at this time. Let's see what the future brings. Thank you to those who have expressed interest.
