Airport Update

ur two TWRA committee members who attended the last Airport Forum on your behalf reported the guest speaker was the Senior Instructor for Flight Options (a company who does a major portion of flight training from the airport and have a variety of different aircraft used in the training), and he stated that most circuit training is designed to minimise noise for neighbouring residents. Some of the training does include "touch and go" and varying types of landings at the airport, which means the aircraft is flying circuits and each circuit is based on a 6 minute interval. Any night flying training is completed by 8.00pm.

The expansion of the airport facilities is ongoing with allweather shelters and 9 taxi bays now in operation. The airport is expected to be carbon neutral by 2016. Unfortunately the public consultation for the expansion of the new runway has been delayed a few months, but EIS approvals are still expected by mid-2014. The Air New Zealand ongoing trial was considered a success with 8371 passengers coming in over the 17 week period. The load factor was 81% and created a turnover for the economy of \$22 million.

Where Do They Go?

Believe it or not, if you sweep leaves and debris into the drains in the gutters in the street, they will do one of two things (or both) – they will block the drain and they will make their way into our waterways. They don't just disappear.

With all the leaves falling recently, some unthinking people have been observed sweeping them into the drains. Not a good idea. When it does rain heavily, we want the drains to work properly. Council does sweep the streets occasionally.

If you think the leaf and debris build-up in the street is at problem stage, you can always ring the Council's Customer Call Centre (5475 7272) and ask them to plan a sweep of the street. So, do the right thing!

eanne Harrison, the Sunshine Coast's Salvation Army's Regional Public Relations Co-coordinator, reports that last December more than 600 families were assisted by them. She said "If you include dependents (partners and/or children/ grandchildren) this is 1800 people who have benefitted in some way from this assistance." She added "There are many more families who are too proud to visit them and just sadly go without."

Signs of Stroke – F.A.S.T.

Recognise the signs of stroke call 000. A stroke is always a medical emergency. Using the **FAST** test involves asking three simple questions:

Face: Check their face. Has their mouth drooped?

Arm: Can they lift both arms?

Speech: Is their speech slurred? Do they understand you?

Time: Is critical!

If you see any of these signs call 000 straight away.

These are the most common signs of stroke, but they are not the only signs. Other signs of stroke may include one, or a combination of weakness or numbness or paralysis of the face, arm or leg on either or both sides of the body; difficulty speaking or understanding; dizziness, loss of balance or an unexplained fall; loss of vision, sudden blurring or decreased vision in one or both eyes; headache, usually severe and abrupt onset or unexplained change in the pattern of headaches; difficulty swallowing. The signs of stroke may occur alone or in combination and they can last a few seconds or up to 24 hours and then disappear.

What is a stroke?

A stroke happens when blood supply to the brain is interrupted. Brain cells usually die shortly after the stroke starts. However, some can last a few hours, if the blood supply is not cut off completely. If the blood supply can be returned in the minutes and hours after the stroke, some of these cells may recover. If not, they will also die.

The number of NHW groups have fallen from 620 to 440. When the Newman Government took over, they wanted to give a boost to Community Policing so they gave them \$500,000 with up to \$1.5 million to follow up provided NHW can increase its membership.

NHW management will move to a mainly online organisation with online members and all new NHW groups will be online. The online area will work through a blog and Facebook. Our NHW group will have a blog site which would be kept current mainly by police. Say, if we had a "missing dog" or a "break and enter" the co-ordinator would add an article. Each time a new article is added, all members would receive an email (similar to the TWRA sending emails).

Qld Police has introduced new web-based system whereby crime stats can be viewed via the new "Crime Map Online" facility. Go to www.police.qld.gov.au click on Crime Map Online and follow the prompts.

Break-ins and stealing unfortunately increases over the holiday period so remember to observe all the usual precautions.
