Airport News

∧ t our February meeting one of our members, ADavid Nielsen, put forward his views on a possible future commercial use of Maroochy airport. David envisaged making the Maroochydore the hub for air cargo for Australasia, Oceania and SE Asia. We arranged for David, along with two of our members met with the airport's General Manager, Peter Pallot, to put forward these views, with the understanding that they were not endorsed by TWRA. Mr Pallot heard David's ideas and then explained in detail that air cargo was not big business in Australia. He said that no dedicated air cargo freighter planes operated here and that air cargo was carried in the holds of passenger aircraft around Australia.

Mr Pallot went on to explain that they were working towards making aircraft maintenance a major part of the future commercial use of the airport as well as increased flights to other destinations in Australia and other close-by countries. When the new runway is completed it will be capable of taking aircraft which could fly to Europe with one stop and

The Ultimate Gift

∧ ustralia is ranked (per capita) on Athe International Organ Donation & Transplantation registry - after Spain, Belgium, France, USA, Italy, Czech Republic, Ireland, Norway, Finland, Germany, Hungary, Canada, Sweden, Denmark, UK and Poland. South Australians donate more and Queensland's donations haven't altered since 2002. It is important to note that receiving an organ transplant is not a short term fix - it is a long term solution. Stats show that in kidney donations 600 patients have lived on for 32 years. Some facts we should consider :

- 1. One organ & tissue donor can save up to 10 lives.
- 2. In 2010, 309 organ donations gave 931 Australians a new chance in life.
- 3. 91% of Australians agree that organ donation has the potential to save lives - (vet less than 40% don't know their loved one's wishes).
- 4. Australia is a world leader for successful transplant outcomes (yet one of the lowest donation rates in the developed world).
- 5. There are 1700 on the waiting list at all times and they can wait from 6 months to 4 or 5 years.
- 6. The current waiting list is Kidney 1196; Liver 179; Heart 86; Lung 145; Pancreas 33; Intestine 3.

Telstra Mobile Reception

elstra's Regional Manager Kris Carver attended the TWRA General meeting on 14 April in response to the many concerns raised about Telstra mobile reception in Twin Waters. His address was revealing but did not allay the concerns forcefully expressed by residents. He stated that Telstra considers its mobile coverage in Twin Waters to be very good but this refers to coverage "in the open", which is, according to him how all Telco's refer to their coverage. Reception inside homes is affected by many factors, especially building structures metal roof, insulation (Sisalation and the like in walls and ceilings) and the other building materials, plus trees etc in the line with the mobile towers. We are serviced by at least three towers (on Banyandah Towers, at the Toll Plaza on the Motorway and at the back of the APEX camp in Nojoor Road). The overlapping signal cells from the towers vary in size during the day according to the level of demand usage - they shrink during high usage. These are the problems.


The recent conversion to 4G transmissions may improve reception. Telstra has a new product that can be purchased or rented to boost signals inside a dwelling. We suggest vou check with Telstra on the specific product details. Optus and Vodafone, who share the towers with Telstra, would appear to have the same issues regarding mobile reception. On a slightly different, relevant topic, there is limited/no capacity in the Mudjimba telephone exchange for new ADSL customers. This is also a problem for residents in Twin Waters in that has been exacerbated by the state of the NBN rollout. Maybe we are now better informed, but this is a still a work-in-progress as far as we are concerned
