Japanese development company Sekisui House have recently released preliminary plans for a development on part of the beachside old Hyatt golf course at Yaroomba. The plan is for about 1470 apartment dwellings, a 250 room high class hotel, retirement/aged care and retail all on about 20 hectares and with some buildings having a height of 39 metres. Potentially it would have a population similar to Twin Waters.

Airport Expansion

In a joint presentation at our general meeting on October 13, Airport Manager Peter Pallett and retired engineer Ken Vaughn, TWRA Committee member both gave extremely interesting presentations on the expansion of the Sunshine Coast Airport. They also noted that the Environmental Impact Statement for the proposed new runway expansion project at the Sunshine Coast Airport has been released for public review and comment.

Prepared by the SC Council, the EIS describes the project and its potential environmental impacts, both positive and negative. The project has an expected capital expenditure of \$347 million and includes a new 2,450m long by 45m wide north-west/ south-east runway capable of servicing such aircraft such as the A330, B787 and B777 plus associated infrastructure. The single EIS addresses State and Commonwealth

2014 and we understand that pressure is being put on the council to approve the development. Our local Councillor, Jason O'Pray, is strongly against approval outside the provisions of the current plan. While he recognises tourism growth is of major importance to the Sunshine Coast – in fact, stresses that we need a world ranking 5-6 star hotel but points out that we should note the majority of the current Sekisui plan is to build 1,470 residential apartments. This involves 17 buildings including 5 to a

The TWRA long supported the proposed development of the East-West runway and welcomes the release of the EIS. The potential impacts for Twin waters are positive and we support also the jobs, tourism benefits and positive impacts for housing values etc in our area as well as for the wider Sunshine Coast. We will be making a submission in support of the EIS and encourage residents to make their individual submissions. Light Rail on Coast

65% of Sunshine Coast residents surveyed on whether we need light rail on the Sunshine Coast have praised its proposed introduction despite the cost estimate for the 23km stretch costing in the vicinity of \$2billion. Mayor Jamieson suggests it could link the airport to Caloundra and pass through Maroochydore CBD and Mooloolaba then on to Kawana Health precinct and terminate in Caloundra.

Statistics show that Caloundra will hold 60% of the Coast's population by



2031 and in the next 20 years the Coast's population is expected to grow by more than 50%. That's 150,000 new residents! Possible routes will be issued in early November then a 12-18 month feasability study and community consultation will ensue.


St John Ambulance
