We are hoping to discuss with the Qld Police Service how we can assist them to achieve better policing results by co-operating more closely with our community. We have an active Neighbourhood Watch setup and we have well-established communications here via our TWRA emails, TWRA web page and Facebook account. We are, in modern terms, a "connected community". When police incidents occur that affect Twin Waters, we believe we can assist by providing very quick communications of key details so that prompt assistance can be provided to police. Obviously, this can only happen with the support and co-operation of the police. But if someone goes missing, or a crime occurs, then getting all of our community quickly informed and on the lookout seems like a good idea. We are hopeful that protocols can be established with police to give us better police outcomes and security in the future.

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## Canine Caper

There has been an increase in the number of dogs being walked off-leash around Twin Waters.

A reminder that we have no "Dogs-Off Leash" areas in Twin Waters and have no suitable areas for making one. The Maroochy North Shore beach or the Dog Park on Keith Royal Drive are our closest off-leash areas if you wish to let your dog run free.

Having dog that is off leash come running up to you can be confronting for many people and other dogs. Even the most well trained dog can react unpredictably when faced with strange dogs, passing traffic or wildlife. While you may be able to control your dog you cannot control the reaction of other people or their pets. Please, when walking your dog keep it under control by having it on-leash at all times. Council dog rangers do make regular patrols of the area and you risk a fine by not compiling with the on-leash requirements.

While on the dog walking subject, please remember that it is the law for you to pick up after your canine companion. Take plastic bags with when you leave the house and place all waste in the bin.

We live in a beautiful safe area for walking our beloved pets, please help us keep it that way.

## The Twilight Bark

Keeping with the doggie theme, do you know what your dog gets up to while you are at out and about or at work? There have been reports recently of dogs continually barking while their owners are away from home. This can be distressing for both the dogs and those living nearby.

While the Council can issue fines for excessive barking, it is better if these situations can be dealt with before it gets to this stage. If barking dogs are a problem for you, please, firstly let your neighbours know that this is happening while they are out, they may not be aware of the situation.

## Best Dog Off Lead Areas

Want to take your dog for an off-leash walk without the risk of being hit with an expensive fine?

Below is a handy list of some of the Sunshine Coast Council's approved off-leash areas for dogs on the Coast.

**Remember: If there's no sign, your dog must be on a lead at all times.**

**BEERWAH PARK:** Mill Park, Simpson Street (fenced area). Off-leash at all times.

**BLI BLI PARK:** Muller Park (Reserve 375) as designated on signage provided in the park. Off-leash at all times.

**BUDDINA PARK:** Point Cartwright Reserve, off-leash and on-leash areas. At times and locations indicated on signs. Timed areas 4pm to 8am\*.

**BUDDINA FORESHORE RESERVE:** Eastern side of Point Cartwright headland, south to Gulai Street. Beach access 198 to 201. Off-leash at all times.

**BUDDINA BEACH:** Mawarra Avenue to Talinga Street Beach access 210 to 217, Off-leash at all times.

**BUDERIM PARK:** Elizabeth Daniels Park, Syd Lingard Drive (fenced area) Off-leash at all times.

**COOLUM BEACH:** Northern end of Coolum Beach Caravan Park extending 1km north of Stumers Creek. Beach access 67 to 72. Off-leash at all times.

**DICKY BEACH PARK:** Coochin Park, Cnr Beerburum and Cooroy streets. Off-leash at all times.

**LITTLE MOUNTAIN PARK:** Little Mountain Common (fenced area): Off-leash at all times. Meridan Downs Park, Winchester Road: Off-leash at all times.

**MALENY PARK:** Maleny Showgrounds: Off-leash at all times.

**MARCOOLA PARK:** Reserve 2481, Keith Royal Drive, as designated on signage provided in the park (fenced area): Off-leash at all times.

**MAROOCHYDORE PARK:** On the riverside of Bradman Avenue, commencing at the traffic lights at the intersection of Fishermans Road and Bradman Avenue and extending 500 metres towards the Maroochy River mouth: Off-leash at all times.

**MINYAMA PARK:** Jessica Park - Western end, Nicklin Way: Off-leash at all times.

**MOUNTAIN CREEK PARK:** Quota Hideaway Park, Cootamundra Drive: Off-leash at all times.

## NORTH SHORE BEACH, TWIN WATERS:

North Shore Beach, Twin Waters between the low water mark and the base of the dunal area, extending from the Maroochy River to a point 500 metres south of the safety flagged bathing area, Twin Waters Surf Club beach access 132: Off-leash at all times.

**SHELLEY BEACH:** Russel Street to Victoria Terrace. Beach access 276 to 281: At times indicated on signs 4pm to 8am May to October\*.

**SIPPY DOWNS PARK:** Chancellor Village Park (fenced area); Off leash at all times.

**TOWN OF SEASIDE BEACH:** From beach access 97 to beach access 98: 5am to 8am and 5pm to 8pm.

**WARANA PARK:** Dog Park opposite Rata Street on Nicklin Way (fenced area): Off-leash at all times.

**WURTULLA BEACH:** Maloga Street, Buddina to Wurley Drive, Wurtulla Beach access 226 to 247: Off-leash at all times

## Lost Your Phone?

The police recommend that everyone consider downloading an app to help locate lost or stolen devices.

There are many free apps available for smart phones or tablets that can assist in locating your device if it is ever lost or stolen.

A quick look in the Google Play and the Apple App Store brings up many free options. It is worth looking to see which will be suit your needs best and for ease of use. Some examples are:

- Android - Android Device Manager, Find my Android Phone, Lost Android.
- Apple - Find my iPhone, Prey Anti Theft, SecureIT Anti theft.

Police urge not to try and recover the device yourself that in the instances where it is stolen and you are able to locate it via these GPS tracking apps. Report it to police and let them know that you've got information about the location of your stolen phone.

The more information you have, the more likely police are able to recover the phone for you.

Police also recommend that you password protect your phone and record the IMEI number for future reference.

If your phone does get stolen, report it immediately to Policelink by calling 131 444.

## Street Parking

As everyone is aware of our streets here in Twin Waters are very narrow in places. An increase in the number of vehicles owned by residents and a trend for adult children to stay in the family home for a lot longer has resulted in households often having more vehicles than the standard two-car garage can accommodate. As a result an overflow of vehicles are being parked on our narrow streets.

This can make the streets difficult to navigate when there are multiple cars parked on the roadside. Please consider all residents choosing your parking spot. There must be a minimum of 3 metres between cars parked in narrow streets. If it is found that parked cars are obstructing a roadway the council could issue a fine.
