Further Canelands / Stockland Update

The Mayor, Mark Jamieson, called a meeting on 16 September of all the main stakeholders involved with the Stockland / Canelands matter. The purpose was to review all work done to date and to ensure that all stakeholders were "on the same page" so that Council could move forward with the request from Stockland for an amendment of the Planning Scheme for the Canelands. All of the principal Council officers were present, including, the Mayor, Cr Dickson (Chair of the Planning Committee) and Cr. O'Pray plus relevant Council management and officers. The State government was represented by officers from Dept. of Transport & Main Roads (DTMR) and Dept. of Local Government & Infrastructure Planning (DLGIP). Stockland was represented by their Regional Manager and the Project Manager, plus their technical and engineering consultants. The TWRA was represented by Peter Braithwaite, Geoff Billard, Evan Flower, Ken Vaughn and Max Mills.

Council planning officers reported on their work to date, including their recent detailed discussions with TWRA to make sure that our requirements had been addressed. They also reported on the options for the principal entry / exit point for any development on the site to David Low Way with a possible second entry via Godfreys Road and connections to the existing Twin Waters via walkways, bikeways and possible minor traffic for intra-community They also outlined the connections. heritage studies relating to the Settler's Park area and its implications for one of the traffic options. The parties expressed a preference for the David Low Way / Ocean Drive roundabout as the main traffic solution. TWRA also expressed support for Stockland reaffirmed their this option. support for the work done to date and that they were neutral about either this option or the De Vere Road roundabout option.

On the subject of Settler's Park, Council's heritage consultant has confirmed that some adjustments to the Park boundaries and its incorporation into an entry

statement (including especially preserving the mango trees) would not be detrimental and would in fact provide a better outcome from a heritage viewpoint.

The bottom line is that all parties at the meeting seem to be on the same page and that there are no issues outstanding for them that would prevent Council formally considering the request for a Planning Scheme Amendment at a special meeting in October.

The timetable moving forward would likely include: Council may formally consider the request in October; if supported by Council, the request would be formally submitted to the State Government for their consideration (timing uncertain as Council does not control this); assuming State support, a public consultation period for the proposed Planning Scheme Amendment would be held around mid-2016 and subject to any further considerations the final decision/approval for a Planning Scheme Amendment relating to the Canelands may be made around end-2016. Stockland could submit their detailed Development Application (DA) to Council, which would also subsequently require a public consultation period. At the recent meeting, Council also restated the issue of waterways was of high importance in any future DA and the requirement that any development not impact the current quality of waterways as currently monitored.

The Mayor thanked all parties for their involvement and contributions. In particular, he noted and expressed appreciation for the extensive consultation with the Twin Waters community and the role of the TWRA in working with Stockland to achieve an outcome that would add value to the whole area.

Shark Sightings

As weather warms up, people are again starting to make use of the waterways around Twin Waters. Please, all kayakers, stand-up paddle boarders, those fishing and swimming (both people and dogs) be aware that there have been more sightings of sharks in these waters. They are more than likely Bull Sharks. While we have previously been advised that Bull Sharks under two metres in length are less dangerous than larger individuals, we must remember that the waterways are the home of these and other animals and swimming is not advised. This is why the "No Swimming" signs are in place around Twin Waters. Please take care when using our waterways and if you wish to swim, make use of one of our beautiful beaches.

Problems on Ocean Drive Again

Unfortunately, again, there seem to be person(s) who think it is cool to hoon on Ocean Drive especially on Friday and Saturday nights. Even worse, some have taken to deliberately driving off the road and through our maintained verges and roundabouts. Of course it is not cool. It is completely anti-social behaviour. In the past, good work by our community has ultimately identified the culprits and they have been dealt with by the law. Just a reminder that, if you are aware of hooning, please call the hooning Hotline on 13 HOON (13 4666), or you can report the hooning on-line. It is good if you can provide specific details - car make, colour, number plate, date and time etc but even tracking the times will help Police plan appropriate action. Police penalties for hooning can be severe, especially for repeat offenders.

- improved city services by sharing data which means less wait times and faster service
- · increased safety and a reduction in crime
- attraction of more investment and new business to the area which also attracts new talent, providing more employment opportunities.

To date the Smart City Framework team has spoken to over 20 stakeholder groups and consulted our global network of Smart City experts to select a portfolio of solutions that supports our vision and goals for the Maroochydore Priority Development Area, the enterprise corridor and the broader Sunshine Coast region. Origins of Halloween

It is heading towards that spooky time of the year.... Halloween!


