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Start of the construction of the intersection will be weather related. Intersection construction will take 12-18 months, depending on weather.

Federal approval in relation to environment (EPBC) will take about 18 months and will be independently assessed. Community consultation will take 3-6 months at same time.

There were lots of Council controls with December 2023 preliminary approvals.

There will be a 12-13 Ha of lake with an outlet to the Maroochy River

Water flow into TWW will improve quality of water in the Twin Waters lagoon.

After completion of the detailed plan, if all goes well, there will be 18-24 months of lake and site construction before opening plots for sale to market. Thus

3--3.5 years from now until first lots for sale.

Plan to keep as much vegetation as possible.

Protection of mango trees and Settlers Park is of major concern to Stockland to protect this heritage site.

Q Water flow control to stop water back into TW lake
A: Very detailed plan to control and ensure waterflow will flow
to Maroochy River; Plan includes a pumping unit that Stockland
will create a payment for 80 years.

Q Re turbine to to push water towards Maroochy River Will that be at cost to ratepayers?

A; No turbine required for water to exit the TWW lake; but pump system will be required to pump water for TW lagoon up into the new TWW lake.

Q In masterplan will there be public transport 'A Planned for bus to go through main road through TWW, not the residential streets

Q Evacuation plan

A Yes; two parts ... northern area plus access through Esperance Roundabout and a safety refuge to be built on site.

Also Stockland sees potential for some shops (IGA type store and café) to accommodate the community around the church hall site.

Q Waterflow Won't come back into TW what about stormwater

A No, stormwater and waterflow will all flow towards Maroochy River

All detail design will be done and submitted to all relevant authorities

Q How long will the construction phase take A 5-6-7 years depending on delays with approvals and weather. Stockland screening will be put up around site when construction

due to commence.

Stage 1 will be construction of DLW intersection and then develop plan of starting site construction

Development access will be through Godfreys Rd with Buffer corridors to protect TW

Q Balance with detail and present more detail to TWRA in future?

A Yes, at relevant stages

Q Are you speaking with current local residents in De Vere Rd A Yes, conversation with affected residents and will keep them informed; also residents on DLW Most of which are owned by State G

Q Covenant re build after settlement of sale of lots?

A Generally building required to commence within 12 months but difficult to enforce.

Q will there be Rigidity of designs/colours
A Stockland will be expecting high standard, with some controls of colours/textures

There will be some covenants that will expect some planting of trees

TWW#3 will be premium development with a limited number of houses

Q Richard re heights and height of slab and buildings A JS didn't have specific detail, but yes there would be controls to comply with Council requirements

Q Flood risk ... how will it be controlled A Approval restrictions; flood model has to be presented back to Council and will need to be updated with each stage of development

Q The weir at the entrance to the TW lagoon has required repairs in recent years, wont the increased water flow and water velocities result in even greater need to repairs to the TW weir and rock revetments? And who will pay for these additional repairs?

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A JS not aware of this issue.

		The EDQ must present a high level development scheme by July 2024 for the northern runway precinct of the Airport. They will determine what the future use of the land could be and what impact it will have on the surrounding community. Of particular interest was the	
		increase in traffic and the possibility of additional access to David Low Way from the northern precinct . There will be a 30day community consultation period.	
		Airport News YTD traffic through the Airport was 1.9M an increase of 24%, due to the introduction of Bonza airlines and increased demand after Covid. Next year expected increase is just 5%. New routes so far include Darwin in Nov 2023 and Launceston (LST) from the 29/03/2024. Bonza will operate twice weekly services to LST on Mondays and Fridays. Greater frequency and addition services are expected to Auckland, Canberra, Perth, Hobart and Adelaide. Improvements to the check-in hall with automatic bag drop and improved technology in the security screening area with the introduction of body scanners are all planned. Air Services Australia There was at total 72 complaints received from 35 complainants. The Mudjimba residents association is still very vocal about the increased noise and late arrival aircraft.
