Jason talked about the controversial development applications lodged by Stockland and his journey as a Councillor... 3 x DA's ... door knocking 780 houses on earlier DA's

TWW#3 ... Jason door-knocked 380 houses to seek TW resident opinions (He asked 'Do you support ... yes/no or thirdly don't care'). Of the answers he received "Don't care" was the clear winner, Jason voted in favour of the DA and the Council voted 6:4 in favour.

Jason was a major supported of the refurbishment of change room facilities at the sports ground beside North Shore Community Centre including specific change rooms for female referees/umpires.

FUTURE: as population changes Old runway safety zone ... adjoins the community centre; new facilities and the facilities –sport and rec plan. Possibly low cost accommodation.

Possibility of environmental nursery utilising some space there.

Jason has been involved with many of the Twin Waters Maintenance Reference Group meetings and achievement; he was supportive of the replacement of significantly damage footpaths Which will happen over a 5 year time frame.

Jason attended about 35 or so meetings (of TWRA) Questions: WillI Stockland only build 450 houses; Answer: Guarantee that no more than 450 will be built on the parcel of land ... locked in because of the conditions placed on Stockland by Council

If there is a change to the DA, then that would have to come back to Council and go through the same process again.

Q: (Derek) How accommodate path, railway (CAMCROS Rail corridor) as part of the plan

9	Maintenance Committee	Tony Freeman reported that there is an upcoming Maintenance Reference Committee meeting with Council and amongst other topics will be discussion about the TW Maintenance levy which all property owners pay to provide superior service in the TW public areas Including the 63 parks in TW (including the pocket parks. Discussion will also be around the "entrance/area" signs within TW last painted 8.5 years back with a paint life of around 10 years. It is expected that this will be a capital cost by Council; Some palm from pruning has been questioned and Council and contractors have attended to. Additional pruning, such as larger street trees will also be discussed at the meeting with Council	
10	Airport Forum	Kevin Lyons reported significant growth at the airport annual passenger loads now exceed 1.6 million (on a moving base) Tenders are being called to refurbish/enlarge the terminal as it's no longer coping with increased traffic
