President's Report from Sophie Lever

Where did the year go? Suddenly its Christmas in a moment and 2023 bites the dust! But what a year it has been!

We've seen Twin Waters jumping out of its skin with energy and community involvement. And facing serious decisions about its future. Decisions forced on it because it's a place people want to be.



The Twin Waters West proposal burst forward again when developer Stockland fronted up for its third attempt to create an appropriate housing estate on the second half of Twin Waters land – the old canefields running parallel with the Sunshine Coast Motorway.

If approved the project is the biggest individual change to Twin Waters since the suburb was established by original developer Lend Lease before the turn of the century. There are those for and against – and the Sunshine Coast Council has an 'interesting' time ahead as it

processes the proposal. And if they say no, there is also the extra step when the proposal is bumped upstairs to the Queensland Government's, Planning and Environment Court, which decided the issue on the two previous attempts.

Development energy continued across the boundary line at nearby Pacific Paradise with the proposal to re-develop the old Bowls Club into a major hotel, apartment and shopping district to sit alongside the existing North Shore Tavern. (See Page 4 for details on Public Comments to Council.)

As we note later in this newsletter, Sunshine Coast Council is now calling for public comments. And again, whether you are either for or against, the reality of these



applications says something about the economic future of Twin Waters and its surrounding areas.

Social interaction was also at an all time high this year.

We've just enjoyed the second Birthday Party in the Park in its new venue at the Twin Waters Shopping Village. A great afternoon packaged by L.J Hooker Twin Waters that then produced a hefty donation to the local State Emergency Services. More details inside.

Sharks and the Lake

November was Shark Month for Twin Waters.





Residents on the lake and others on their afternoon walks noticed the appearance of a series of red coloured buoys.

Set by researchers from Sunshine Coast University, they were intended to trap sharks which would then be tagged for on-going monitoring.

Local media featured stories of research leader, Dr. Bonnie Holmes and her team during the 'up close and personal' tagging process. These people have no fear. The 3-year program aims to survey in detail just how many bull sharks are in Sunshine Coast Waters and learn how they travel in and out of coastal river systems and waterways, like Twin Waters. They believe the more we know, the more likely it is we can safely co-exist together.

As it happens, the team didn't catch any sharks in the Twin Waters Lake. But, that doesn't mean they aren't there.





On 14 November, Dr. Holmes was called in by the Sunshine Coast Council following the discovery of a 2.30 metre long (7.5 feet) shark that had been found dead on the ramp on Anchorage Circuit (beside Water Gallery)



Dr. Holmes summed it up on her Instagram post with the background story and some friendly advice for how we can give sharks and other marine life more consideration so, we can all share the space: "A few days ago this beautiful boy washed up in Twin Waters on the Sunshine Coast after snapping off a recreational shark fishing line with around 10metre of rope attached. The trace and rope had wrapped around an old crab pot underwater and (he) drowned.

A timely reminder to secure your gear and . . . (that) lost crab pots also kill fish, turtles and sometimes air breathing animals like birds < 😹 👞 🖕 "

During the year, Brisbane's Griffith University has also surveyed the sharks in Twin Waters Lake. Dr Johan Gustafson from Griffith's Marine Megafauna group at the Coastal and Marine Research Centre will give a talk on their work.

Local Disaster Management

Some residents have contacted TWRA for information about disaster management in the event of a local bushfire. Sunshine Coast Council has a Disaster Hub on their website: https://disasterhub.sunshinecoast.qld.gov.au/#Dashboard.

Information there covers Evacuation Centres / Places of Refuge (when needed); Road Closures; Warnings etc. Plus relevant Apps such as CoastAlert enabling emergency notifications direct to your phone as well as the Get Ready Queensland guide published by the State Government. Council has also confirmed to TWRA that the cleared area immediately adjacent to Twin Waters meets fire-break requirements and that this area may be mowed again before Christmas.

Maintenance Update



Residents on Lake View Drive woke to find a 'Mountain of Mulch' in November as the Plant Management Company completed its major mulching program. In addition to being spread on gardens, the hoop pine product was also applied to roundabouts and entrance areas to the estate.

The dreaded, ever falling Palm Fronds also received attention. Now, fronds from palms in public areas have been added to the Plant Management Company's work system. There has also been some spraying to reduce Bindii growth. Mowing and garden work is now on a two-weekly cycle.

The condition of Pocket Parks is being followed up, although some work has been completed.
